MARCH 2023 Dear Church,

As we inhabit the Season of Lent this month, consider this classic illustration about a jar, rocks, pebbles, and sand:

A professor stood up before his class with a large empty mayonnaise jar. He filled the jar to the top with large rocks and asked his students if the jar was full. The students said that yes, the jar was full. He then added small pebbles to the jar, and gave the jar a bit of a shake so the pebbles could disperse themselves among the larger rocks. Then he asked again, "Is the jar full now?" The students agreed that the jar was full. The professor then poured sand into the jar to fill up any remaining empty space. The students then agreed that the jar was completely full. The professor went on to explain that the jar represents everything that is in one's life.

The large rocks are equivalent to the most important things you have going on. This means that if the pebbles and the sand were lost, the jar would still be full and your life would still have meaning. The pebbles represent the things in your life that matter, but that you could live without. These things often come and go, and are not permanent or essential to your overall well-being. The sand represents the remaining filler things in your life and material possessions. These things don't mean much to your life as a whole, and are likely only done to waste time or get small tasks accomplished.

What if you attempt to fill the jar by beginning with the sand, then the pebbles, and finally the large rocks? All of the items will not fit in the jar. This holds true with the things you let into your life. If you spend all of your time on the small and insignificant things, you will run out of room for the things that are actually important. The point is this: pay attention to the "rocks." It is important to manage the things that really matter first.

I use all of this to pose a question: In your living right now, how do God, church, and spiritual practices fit? Are they large rocks, pebbles, or sand? Are they of utmost importance, or are they for when other commitments and time are left over? May you seek God and his kingdom first this Lent.






